Read on to discover more about this month's featured galleries and their contributions to Art Palm Beach 2025, as we continue our mission to highlight the best in contemporary and modern art.


Gallery Highlights

Casterline|Goodman Gallery, Aspen, Colorado

In the heart of Aspen, Colorado, Casterline|Goodman Gallery offers fine art and expert advisory services. Founded by Robert Casterline and Jordan Goodman, the gallery blends experience in both primary and secondary art markets.

Casterline brings over two decades of art investment expertise, while Goodman contributes his background in contemporary furniture design and architecture.

For Art Palm Beach 2025, Casterline|Goodman Gallery will feature works by Daniel Yocum (b. 1994). This American artist, influenced by the New York School, takes a hip-hop approach to figurative abstract expressionism. Yocum's work, characterized by vivid colors and lurking marks of black, often features imagery of cars and flowers. His influences include Phillip Guston, Cy Twombly, Robert Crumb, and Andy Warhol.

Rebecca Hossack Art Gallery, London

For thirty-six years, Rebecca Hossack Art Gallery has been shaping the landscape of contemporary art from its base in London. Since 1988, the gallery has built an international reputation for its innovative approach, championing individuality and artistic excellence.

A pioneer in promoting Non-Western artistic traditions, Rebecca Hossack was the first in Europe to exhibit Australian aboriginal painting. The gallery continues this commitment through its regular Songlines seasons and has curated significant exhibitions featuring art from the Bushmen of the Kalahari, Papua New Guinea, and tribal India.

Rebecca Hossack showcases a diverse range of artists including painters Carla Kranendonk, David Whitaker, and Mersuka Dopazo, sculptor Ross Bonfanti, ceramicist Avital Sheffer, and printmakers Phil Shaw and Rose Blake. The gallery has commissioned new works from the talented Mersuka Dopazo, set to debut at the upcoming show. Visitors to Art Palm Beach 2025 in January will have a unique opportunity to experience these fresh creations firsthand.

Ai Bo Gallery, New York

New York-based Ai Bo Gallery, founded by Glenn Aber in 2007, has evolved into a premier destination for fine contemporary art. The gallery showcases a diverse array of mediums including sculpture, photography, glass, mixed media, and paintings from artists worldwide.

Owner Glenn Aber has traveled extensively for more than 35 years. It was during these journeys, particularly throughout Asia, that he developed his expertise in Asian art. This experience initially led to the establishment of Ai Bo Fine Asian Art, with the mission to introduce emerging and established artists from Vietnam, China, and Southeast Asia to the U.S. market.

In 2013, recognizing the global nature of contemporary art, Aber rebranded as Ai Bo Gallery, expanding its focus beyond Asian art to embrace a more international perspective. Today, the New York gallery represents a carefully curated selection of artists from around the world, offering a rich tapestry of contemporary artistic expression. For Art Palm Beach 2025, Ai Bo Gallery will present works by three notable artists: Bojana Ilic Bojitt, Ali Hasmut, and Lee Song Joon. 


