

It's a Wrap! Art Palm Beach 2025 Sets New Benchmarks in Sales and Attendance!

Art Palm Beach 2025 concluded with remarkable results, nearly doubling attendance from last year and achieving exceptional sales levels. The show established the Palm Beach County Convention Center as a focal point for global creativity, bringing together an impressive gathering of international art galleries and dedicated collectors.

The show opened with a series of striking installations that captured public attention. A 36-foot bear titled "*Ominka*" by artist **Viktor Frešo**, presented by Danubiana Museum of Art Bratislava, Slovakia, and curated by Marisa Caichiolo, welcomed visitors at the front entrance on Okeechobee Blvd. This was followed by the arrival of "*Big Birk*," the world's largest Birkin Bag, handcrafted by **GEO** and presented by Denis Leon Gallery, which made its way to the convention center under police escort, drawing crowds of onlookers.

Inside, visitors were greeted by *"Eternal Light – 21c the Last Judgment,"* an extraordinary installation by Korean artist **Hanho**. This presentation, curated by Monica Hye Yeon Jun, Ara and Anahid Oshagan, was a collaboration between Reflectspace Gallery, Glendale Library, Arts & Culture (Glendale), and Culture Nomad (Seoul).

The market demonstrated remarkable strength across all segments, with significant sales spanning modern masters, contemporary icons, and emerging artists. Modern Fine Art, New York, presented both **Marc Chagall's** *"1956 Esquisse pour le Grand Cirque"* and **Mark Eisen's** debut sculpture. International galleries made their mark with Corridor Contemporary (Tel Aviv) placing **George Condo's** *"Linear Portrait"* and Raphael (Frankfurt/Paris) selling both **Alex Katz**'s *"Autumn 5, 2024"* and **Takashi Murakami's** *"My Sincerity to You*".

Miami galleries also saw strong results, with Adamar Fine Art selling **Wayne Thiebaud's** *"Park Place"*, and Markowicz Fine Art placing **Kai's** *"Endless Possibilities"* bronze sculpture. Palm Beach spaces showed equal momentum, with Rosenbaum Gallery (Palm Beach/Boca Raton) successfully presenting **Maikel Martinez's** *"Dream Worlds"* series and Provident Fine Art (Palm Beach) selling **Paul Nagy's** *"Bullet Flag."*

The show's global reach was further evidenced by sales of **Hans Hofmann's** *"Untitled, 1963"* (Hollis Taggart, New York), **Sangmin Lee's** *"Blue & White Porcelain Bowl"* from Lee

& Bae, Seoul, and Peter Halley's "No Exit" presented by Galeria Cortina, Spain.

Producer and Director Kassandra Voyagis noted, "Art Palm Beach 2025 exceeded all expectations. The energy from collectors and art lovers was contagious. Thanks to the dedication of our galleries and the power of art to inspire and connect, this year's event was nothing short of extraordinary."

A notable trend this year was the increased presence of new collectors, with Hollis Taggart observing "a new generation of younger, energized buyers" actively participating in the market. This evolution in the collector base points to continued growth in the art market and reinforces Palm Beach's position as a key destination for contemporary and modern art.

Art Palm Beach will return to the Palm Beach County Convention Center from January 28 to February 1, 2026, with plans to build on this year's success.


